Biographies



Aditi Nerurkar, MD, MPH is an integrative medicine physician and the Medical Director of the Cheng -Tsui Integrated Health Center at Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center. Her clinical expertise is in mind-body medicine, stress management and an integrative approach to complex illness. Her research expertise is in incorporating mind-body therapies into conventional medical care. She has published several studies on doctors prescribing mind-body therapies and stress-management in JAMA Internal Medicine. These days, Dr Nerurkar is increasingly involved in the media & health communication as a medical contributor and correspondent. She has been featured in Oprah

Magazine, CNN, NPR, and the WSJ. Most recently, she was a panelist at the Forbes 30 Under 30 Summit and was voted a Top Breakthrough in Integrative Medicine by the Huffington Post. She has also been featured in the Top Doctors Issue of Boston Magazine. Dr Nerurkar is currently the host of Thrive Global's The Parenthood Journey, led by Arianna Huffington.



Joseph Grossman, MD is originally from Flint, Michigan. He graduated from the University of Michigan with a degree in Economics in 1999, then worked in NYC in theater and television at MTV and as a video editor before joining the postbacc program at Columbia University where he made surgical instructional videos. He completed postbacc and graduated from Brown Medical School in 2012, then completed internship and residency in internal medicine at BIDMC, followed by hematology oncology fellowship at BIDMC in 2018. He has been an attending physician for the last year in GI Oncology also at BIDMC, with a research focus on personalized and novel treatments for pancreatic cancer. He is the principal investigator of "A Feasibility Trial of Patient Derived Organoids as a Biomarker for Response to Therapy in Pancreatic Cancer" – the HOPE trial (Harnessing

Organoids for PErsonalized Therapy).



Jessica Butler MAOM, received her Masters of Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine at the New England School of Acupuncture and is licensed by the Massachusetts Board of Registration in Medicine.
